### **Assessment Highlights:**

- BGU's two newest degrees continue to grow in popularity and we look forward to major growth in the upcoming year. In the fall of 2018-19 there were 11 students in the Transformational Entrepreneurship in Missions degree and there are 22 new students accepted for this degree in the fall 2019-20 semester. The Education in Missions degree had four participants in the fall of 2018-19. We already have 31 students accepted into this program for the fall semester 2019-20.
- BGU continues its membership with the Work College Consortium. 89% of BGU students enjoy serving in their practical training positions, as well as, the departments that they are working in. 88% of graduated students from all WCC college believe that their experience was valuable in reducing their college costs.
- We continue to have a strong focus on bringing the Church to where it is not (missions). Our Alumni Survey results show that close to 80% of our three-year alumni have been appointed as missionaries and 20% are in the process of preparing to go to the mission field (e.g., raising support, pursuing additional training). A great benefit of our curriculum is having students complete a significant portion of their studies on the field while doing a 16-month Global Internship. This has proven to be strength for those preparing to do a missionary career.
